

Thanks to a generous donor, we created a fund for parishes to access when their fundraising campaigns run short or unforeseen costs are not accounted for when arranging a budget for their refugee family. This is also an opportunity to donate to this fund by helping those on the ground working directly with the people.

The Migration Office currently works with 17 constituent groups/settlement teams. 10 Catholic parishes, urban and rural. Two schools, St. Mary's and E.D. Feehan and several non-Catholic congregations.

Since the end of August 2022, 61 refugee newcomers have arrived. The migration office currently has 150 more people still in process. They submit 35-50 applications a year; it can be 18 months to 3 years until the refugee arrives.

INTERNATIONAL PRIESTS

For each year of service in the Diocese of Saskatoon, an amount of \$2500 is set aside to be sent to the home Diocese of each of our International priests upon their departure from the Diocese of Saskatoon.

There are currently 41 active including international priests serving parishes in the Diocese of Saskatoon.

A new Environics Survey commissioned by Will Power revealed a changing tide, with younger Canadians aged 18-37 reporting they have already named a charity as a beneficiary of their registered funds (12%) - more than those in the Boomer generation (3%). Similarly, 12% of Gen Z and Millennials (18-37) have already left a charitable donation in their Will, versus 6% of Boomers (55-75). Almost half (46 %) of Canadians support a cause or charity regularly; the majority (69%) have not considered how they can continue that support after their death. Will Power is a national public awareness campaign designed to inspire people to think differently about charitable giving by considering a gift to charity in their Will.

Michael Swan from the Catholic Register writes, "But the Campaign isn't just aimed at individuals. A parish, a foundation, even a diocese can participate in the Campaign.


