A diocesan Marriage Formation Curriculum, created in 2022, is available to all parishes and resource couples. Grief support is offered through various programs:

- From Mourning to Dawn: for bereaved spouses and for bereaved parents.
- Anew: an updated program for those who are separated or divorced

As a Sponsorship Agreement Holder, the Diocese of Saskatoon continues to respond with compassion and urgency to the global refugee crisis.

In 2025, we received over **200** refugee sponsorship requests from individuals and families fleeing war, violence, and persecution. Due to limited resources, we were able to support **30** sponsorships, offering lifechanging support to welcome newcomers from countries such as Afghanistan, Sudan, Eritrea, Ethiopia, and Syria.


